

SNOW PLOWING CONTRACT

PLEASE READ THOROUGHLY!

MAIN ROADS WILL BE PLOWED BEFORE DRIVEWAYS. Town will not plow driveways unless there is at least 4 inches of snowfall. **NO** plowing will be done in the fall or spring if the ground is not frozen, unless there is an emergency, as it can damage the driveway.

Your driveway must be a **minimum of 20 feet wide, clear of obstructions (tree branches, power lines, etc.), have adequate turn around space, and have a vertical clearance of 16 feet.** The Town will not be responsible for any items left in driveways and reserves the right to refuse service if specifications are not met. These specifications also allow for adequate clearances for emergency vehicles such as: ambulances, fire trucks, etc.

The fee of **\$125.00 is PAYABLE IN ADVANCE.** A signed and paid contract must be returned to the Clerk **ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 13.** Any contract returned **AFTER** October 13th must include an additional **\$50.00.** If this is not received, service will not be rendered.

If you wish your driveway plowed and agree to the above, please sign below. Print your name and your address on the appropriate lines and **RETURN THE ENTIRE FORM** with your fee to the Treasurer. Please make your check payable to: **TOWN OF BRULE.** If you wish a copy of this contract, enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope.
